## PAY AS YOU CAN CAFÉ

Coffee, breakfast food, sandwiches and soup for lunch at a price you can afford and offered in a welcoming setting? Who wouldn't be interested?

A group of Bethlehem Moravians including three pastors and three committed lay people are working together to open a Pay as You Can Café somewhere on the West Side of Bethlehem. The idea is that people of any social economic level can come in to eat. Some might not pay at all. Others might be able to pay a little or a moderate amount. Still others might be able to pay a lot. Everyone will be welcome – to eat, to enjoy community, and to volunteer and contribute friendship and skills to the project.

While this project has originated out of discussion amongst members of the BAM Ministries Committee, it will become a project of the larger community and draw upon the people and resources of the Eastern District and Northern Province. #### What is a Watchword?

A "watchword" is a verse from the Bible selected at random to guide us through the year.

The watchword begins its life as part of a pool of carefully selected biblical passages focusing on a broad range of topics such as faith, doubt, discipleship, forgiveness, love, comfort, resisting temptation, living together as a Christian community, etc. Members are encouraged to ponder the significance of the text for their lives during that year. Chosen Watchwords are very meaningful too most and are looked at throughout the year. They are placed in a wallet, on the fridge, on a mirror, used as a bookmark, and used so many ways. It is something to look at and reflect on over the course of a year.

## Board of World Mission Report on December 11, 2021 Tornados in Kentucky

On December 11, 2021, a line of storms passed through Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Missouri, Mississippi, Ohio, and Tennessee. In all, over 50 tornados touched down, with western Kentucky being the hardest hit. Property damage is widespread, and early reports of a death toll between 70 and 100.

We are currently in dialog with the Presbyterian Church (USA), which has its headquarters in Louisville, KY. Initially, the Board of World Mission will be sending a gift to support their emergency response. Following initial rescue operations, we will be evaluating options to support more long-term relief efforts by encouraging willing volunteers to work through our partners. The BWM will supply that information when it is made available to us.

The Rev. Jim Kirk of the Presbyterian Disaster Response team says: "There are an incredible number of people who have been displaced because their home has either been heavily damaged or destroyed, so sheltering is going to be a significant need. This will be an event that will require a long-term response for the rebuilding — just an incredible amount of emotional, spiritual care needs, given the number of fatalities and injuries."

This month's recipe is from Anne Hosterman....

CHICKEN NOODLE SOUP

**DIRECTIONS:** (This make a large pot of soup)

Add more seasonings if you like a spicier soup!

5 quarts water (4 cups = 1 quart) 4 to 5 chicken breasts 2 clove minced garlic 1 teaspoon pepper

2 teaspoons salt 1 Tablespoon dried parsley flakes

2 teaspoons white sugar

1 cup milk 4 tablespoons butter chicken bouillon cubes needed for the amount of water used

whole stalk of celery cut up

bag of carrots cut up... my family likes a lot of carrots, so I use a large bag

#### **Directions**

Place water, chicken, seasonings, sugar, and bouillon in a large pot and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium low and allow to simmer until chicken is done. Remove chicken from broth. Allow chicken to sit on a plate until cool enough to handle. (Sometimes a foam will form on the surface of the broth, simply skim the foam off with a spoon and discard) This is caused from cooking the chicken on too high heat. Use medium low heat when cooking the chicken breasts. When cool enough, shred chicken into coarse pieces. Add milk and butter to broth. Add shredded chicken to broth, carrots and celery then let simmer on medium low heat, until the noodles have dried for at least 1 hour. Add noodles slowly, separating any that may stick, stirring well after each addition. Cook soup over medium heat, stirring often until noodles are done, & juice has thickened. The flour on the noodles will aid in the thickening process. If you want thicker soup, simply mix well: 1 tablespoon flour with 1/4 cup milk, and slowly whisk into soup....stirring often, so that it doesn't form lumps. When the noodles are done to your taste (about 1 hour of simmer time, after adding the noodles), serve & Enjoy!

#### **HOMEMADE EGG NOODLES**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

3 Cups all purpose flour

4 egg

2 teaspoons salt

1/4 to 1/2 cup water.. more if needed

Make a well in center of flour, Add egg and salt; mix thoroughly. Mix in water, 1 tablespoon at a time, until dough is stiff, but easy to roll. Knead for about 5 minutes adding additional flour if necessary to make a dough that is not sticky.

Divide dough in 3 or 4 equal parts. Roll dough, one part at a time, into thin rectangle on well floured board. Less than 1/8" thick. (Keep the remaining dough covered). Make sure that your dough is well floured. Using a pizza cutter, cut piece of floured dough into 1/4" strips. Then cut those long strips into shorter strips. (Cut them into the length you desire your noodles) Place cut noodles onto a clean towel to dry, for about 1 to 2 hours. (Drying keeps the noodles separated when you add them to your broth to cook)

(NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)


